- 1) What is depicted as being destroyed in the first few verses of this chapter? (Zech. 11:1-2)
- 2) Who is depicted as being distraught by this destruction? (Zech. 11:3)
- 3) According to the text, what two things are specifically mentioned as being ruined? (Zech. 11:3)
- 4) What has been the shepherds' attitude toward their flock? (Zech. 11:5)
- 5) What will the Lord no longer have on the inhabitants of the land and what will be the result? (Zech. 11:6)
- 6) Who is the "I" that is speaking in verses seven through fourteen? Be prepared to support your answer in class? (Zech. 11:7-14)
- 7) Who are the afflicted (or poor) of the flock? (Zech. 10:2; 11:5; 11:11)
- 8) What is symbolized by the breaking of the first staff? (Zech. 11:10)
- 9) What New Testament event are verses twelve through thirteen referring to? (Zech. 11:12-13; Mt. 27:9-10)
- 10) What is symbolized by the breaking of the second staff? (Zech. 11:14)
- 11) How is the shepherd who will be raised up described? (Zech. 11:16)
