Study Questions

Galatians 1:11-17

11 For I would have you know, brethren, that the gospel which was preached by me is not according to man. 12 For I neither received it from man, nor was I taught it, but I received it through a revelation of Jesus Christ. 13 For you have heard of my former manner of life in Judaism, how I used to persecute the church of God beyond measure, and tried to destroy it;14 and I was advancing in Judaism beyond many of my contemporaries among my countrymen, being more extremely zealous for my ancestral traditions. 15 But when He who had set me apart, even from my mother's womb, and called me through His grace, was pleased¹⁶ to reveal His Son in me, that I might preach Him among the Gentiles, I did not immediately consult with flesh and blood, 17 nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were apostles before me; but I went away to Arabia, and returned once more to Damascus. (NASB)

- 1. In verses 11-12 Paul states four things about the gospel he preached. What are they?
- 2. What do these four statements teach us regarding how we should view the writings of Paul? See also 2 Pet. 3:15-16
- 3. Our text doesn't directly tell us, but what was it that changed Paul from being a persecutor of the church to a preacher of the gospel?
- 4. Before his conversion, what was Paul zealous for?
- 5. What do you make of Paul's point that he was set apart "even from [his] mother's womb"?
- 6. Thought Question: in what way(s) was Paul called by God's grace?
- 7. What two things did Paul NOT do immediately after his conversion?
